From the Pastor's Desk



Beloved OLPH family members,

October is the month of the Rosary. The origins of this devotion dates back to the 16th century when the Islamic Ottoman Empire presented a serious military threat to western Europe and sent a fleet of ships to attack Christian defenses in southern Europe. Pope Pius V asked that all the faithful pray the Rosary, requesting the intercession of the Blessed Mother. At the end of the Battle of Lepanto, the Holy League was victorious and the expansion of the Ottoman Empire was permanently prevented. The next year, Pius V established a feast on October 7 in honor of the Blessed Mother, as Our Lady of the Rosary to clearly recognize that the Rosary prayer was the reason for their victory. The Rosary is a powerful weapon against all evil. Let us make a pledge to pray the rosary every day in October to ward off evil, diseases and all other calamities.

As in the past we will begin a **10-day Rosary Devotion** starting from Oct Ist through Oct I0th. I urge all the OLPH families to join the daily community Rosary as per the schedule found on Page $\underline{2}$ of the newsletter.

September 29th is the feast of the **Archangels**, and **October 2nd** is the feast of the **Guardian Angels**. Angels have been present since creation and throughout the history of salvation, announcing this salvation from afar or near and serving the accomplishment of the divine plan. St. Augustine says: "'Angel' is the name of their office, not of their nature. If you seek the name of their nature, it is 'spirit'; if you seek the name of their office, it is 'angel': from what they are, 'spirit', from what they do, 'angel." With their whole beings the angels are servants and messengers of God. Because they "always behold the face of my Father who is in heaven" they are the "mighty ones who do his word, hearkening to the voice of his word"(CCC 329, 333)







Hope


Learn about God's infinite mercy.
