Beloved OLPH family members,

On **February 22**nd, we celebrate the feast of the **Chair of St. Peter**. While, it may seem odd to celebrate a Chair, the significance of this feast is that we honor the Office of Peter within the Church. In other words, we honor the Office of our Pope. On this feast day, let us pray for our Holy Father Pope Francis, who now sits in the chair - the office of the bishop of Rome, that he may be blessed in his leadership, service and teaching in the Church.

On **February 25th**, we commemorate the feast of **Blessed Rani Maria**. Sr. Rani was born on 29 January, 1954. She belonged to the Clarist congregation and worked in Madhya Pradesh, India, in aiding the poor to fight for their rights, which put her at odds with the landlords and the wealthy. On Feb 25th 1995, she was brutally stabbed to death on a bus by a man named Samandar Singh who was hired to kill Sr. Rani. In 2002, in a magnanimous gesture, Sr. Rani's family forgave the murderer, who was sentenced to life imprisonment for the murder. At the family's request, he was released from prison, and later he converted to Christianity. Let us pray for the courage and boldness of Sr. Rani to be witnesses of the Gospel till the end of our life.

I have often wondered... Why did God make me a Christian? And... if you have asked that question too, I propose we journey back to the beginning - Genesis - the creation of Man. God created a place called Paradise (Garden of Eden) and he created Man in HIS OWN image to live with him there (Gen 2:8-9). The picture painted in Genesis Chapter 2 is of a blissful garden where God, man, woman, beasts and birds live in perfect harmony. There are lots of trees with delicious fruits, rivers and green landscape. Nobody to tell you to do your homework, no need to work, no fears, no tears, no fights, no wars, no disease...pure and perfect bliss...i.e. a perfect vacation. So, then what happened? Well... the cunning serpent tricked Eve into eating the forbidden fruit, she then gave it to Adam, and thus, they sinned and were asked to leave. Ha! I knew there was some fine-print in this perfect vacation! Except... it was NOT fine-print. God had clearly told Adam NOT to eat the forbidden fruit lest he die (Gen 3:2). Then after Adam and Eve disobeyed the ONE command that was given to them, God actually gave them a chance to repent and take ownership of their fault. God asks Adam, "Have you eaten of the tree which I commanded you not to eat?" (Gen 3:11). Sadly, we do not hear Adam saying "Sorry God, have mercy on me". Instead, he blames Eve and still worse, blames God for creating Eve (Gen 3:13). God then turns to Eve to see if she will repent. But sadly, she too blames the serpent instead of owning up to her fault of listening to the serpent (Gen 3:14). Because of this, they are banished from the blissful Garden of Eden. But God is ever merciful (Wait! How is God merciful if He is punishing them and banishing them?). God is merciful because even after they sinned, He provides for them "clothes made of skin", which means something (an innocent animal) had to be sacrificed as a reparation for their sin (Gen 3:21). His mercy does not end there. He banishes them from Paradise so that NOW they shouldn't eat of the tree of life, and live forever (Gen 3:22). In other words, now that they have already sinned, if they also ate of the tree of life, they would live forever in sin, and God would lose them forever to sin. And so, He places cherubim and a flaming sword to guard the way to the tree of life (Gen 3:24). Thus, Adam and Eve are now out in the real world and need to work hard for a living, get food on the table, suffer pains of childbirth and deal with all the sufferings of the world as we know it.

The mercy of God is revealed to us from the beginning of Creation, but sadly our sins bear consequences that we have to deal with, and generations after us also suffer the consequences of our sins. Thus, our life on this Earth is an exile - but a temporary one. Remember the words we pray every day "poor banished children of Eve" and "after this our exile". The real place where we belong is that perpetual blissful vacation in Paradise.

So...is that it?? Our life here on Earth is to suffer until we die and get to Paradise?? To be continued...
