


BLESSING OF THE CROSS

Lenten Reflection Series – Week 2

As a result of Adam and Eve's disobedience they lost the gift of Eternal Life with God, and so did the rest of humanity. The Catechism tells us that Death was not God's plan, but was an immediate consequence of Original Sin (CCC 1006-1009). However, is this how it really happened? Science clearly shows us man evolved, and many Scientists will argue against Creationism, supporting Evolutionism. While this topic is very vast and beyond the scope of this Lenten reflection, being a Scientist, my simple and humble opinion is that creation and evolution is GOD'S PLAN, i.e., God, in His unfathomable mercy and wisdom creates, and allows for evolution to take its course. And hence, whether or not Adam and Eve ate the forbidden fruit and brought sin into the world, should NOT be our focus. Our focus should be that we lost Eternal life with God because of sin. And now, the real question is whether our fate is to suffer this exile because of our sins until we die? And what happens then? Do we get Paradise and Eternal life? And the answer is yet again...GOD'S MERCY! Without God's mercy we would indeed suffer through this exile, and it is only through His mercy we can get Eternal life again. From the very beginning, God knew that human beings would fall into sin. And therefore, He already had a plan for their salvation even before He created the world – and that plan was JESUS.

God promises Jesus in Genesis! When God cursed the serpent. He said "HE shall bruise your head and you shall bruise HIS heel" (Gen 3:15). That was God telling the serpent that His only Son Jesus will crush the head of Satan by dying on the cross. And what does "you shall BRUISE HIS HEEL" mean? This has many interpretations, but I would like to share one interpretation which touched me. This refers to the last few hours of Jesus hanging on the cross. Those hours were the most agonizing, because death is not instantaneous for a person who is crucified, but very slow and painful. While hanging on the cross, the crucified person finds it extremely difficult to breathe, because the lungs are crushed by the body's weight hanging down. As a result, the body's survival reflex is to use the HEEL to pick up the body and gasp for air. Through those last hours, Jesus must have used his heel (scraping it on the wood) a thousand times to get air and speak His last words. Thus, Satan was able to bruise Jesus' heels, but at the end, the cross of Jesus brought victory over sin, and that same bruised heel of Jesus crushed the serpent's head, fulfilling God's promise.

And God introduces another person into his story of salvation – MARY! He tells the serpent, "I will put enmity between you and THE WOMAN and between your seed and her seed" (Gen 3:15). We see this promise fulfilled in Mary, and her son Jesus. For this reason, Jesus and Mary are referred to as the New Adam and the New Eve.

Are we "poor banished children of Eve" without hope because of our sins? NO! not at all! The Catechism tells us "But why did God not prevent the first man from sinning? St. Leo the Great responds, "Christ's inexpressible grace gave us blessings better than those the demon's envy had taken away." And St. Thomas Aquinas wrote, "There is nothing to prevent human nature being raised up to something greater, even after sin; **God permits evil, in order to draw forth some greater good.** Thus St. Paul says, 'Where sin increased, grace abounded all the more'; and the words sung during Latin rite Easter vigil, 'O truly necessary sin of Adam, O happy fault... which gained for us so great a Redeemer!'" (CCC 412).
